DEVELOPMENTS IN UNITED METHODISM

Developments in United Methodism

Many members of Mt. Zion were able to attend the information meetings led by me in November and February of this past year. If you attended these meetings, or if you have been following the stories in various media outlets, you know that the United Methodist Church has been struggling to come to some forms of agreement about how to go forward together as a church regarding issues of human sexuality. The General Conference of Feb. 2019 approved the "Traditional Plan" which affirmed prior policies with respect to not ordaining self-avowed, practicing homosexuals and not allowing same-sex weddings in United Methodist Churches. The Traditional Plan also provided for stricter enforcement of our current policies, and it is set to be put into effect as of January 2020.

In April of 2019, the Judicial Council (which is like the Supreme Court for the United Methodist Church and makes rulings about whether new pieces of legislation are consistent with our UMC Constitution) ruled that most of the provisions of the Traditional Plan were constitutional, although some of the measures that would be used for enforcement were unconstitutional.

The Western NC Conference met in June of 2019 and elected lay and clergy delegates to the 2020 General Conference, which will take place in May of 2020 in Minneapolis. Most if not all of the delegates who were elected from the Western NC Conference were people who had publicly stated that they were opposed to the Traditional Plan. The Western NC Conference also passed a petition stating that it is opposed to the Traditional Plan. This petition reflects the majority of those who voted at annual conference, but it does not become church law. It will be sent to General Conference for consideration at the May 2020 General Conference. Only General Conference speaks for the whole church and has the authority to establish church policy or polity.

As a congregation, Mt. Zion will continue to abide by the Discipline of the United Methodist Church. Different people within our congregation have different thoughts and feelings on this topic, yet we are all committed to loving each other and our community in the name of Jesus Christ. I want to emphasize again that all people (regardless of their race, nationality, economic condition, or sexual orientation) are welcome at our church and encouraged to participate in our ministries. If you research various media outlets, you may discover a multitude of different proposals for how the United Methodist Church will continue into the future. Different people, churches, and groups are advocating for their proposals, but none of them have any official status unless they are approved by the General Conference of May 2020. If you have more questions about any of these developments, you are welcome to call the church office and make an appointment with me to discuss these matters in more detail. We ask all members of Mt. Zion to pray for the unity of the church and for the church to continue to focus on our mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ.




